Singer/Songwriter tour makes stop at The Shop



Southerly

Kill Rock Stars, a punk-alternative rock label out of Olympia, with The Sound the Hare Heard Tour brings singer-songwriter Southerly, with Thao Nguyen and Lovers to The Shop, June 19 at 7 p.m. The groups will be touring the states, with a quick stop in Spokane, as part of the compilation CD, "The Sound the Hare Heard," recently released May 19. Don't miss it.

"The Sound the Hare Heard," a compilation of singer-songwriters, is the brainchild of Slim Moon, owner of Kill Rock Stars.

"When I'm sifting through demos or following up on tips that people give me, I always pay special attention to the singersongwriter types," says Moon on his website. "I've always had a soft spot for them, from Bob Dylan and Joni Mitchell to Elliott Smith and Joanna Newsom. This compilation is a

distillation of the songwriters--well established, just starting out, or somewhere in between--who have turned me on in the new millennium."

The album features tracks from Southerly, Thao Nguyen, and The Lovers, as well as The Moore Brothers, Essie Jain, Wooden Wand, and Sufjan Stevens. The tour will feature many of these artists on different parts of the tour. Headlining the opening leg is Southerly whose track, "Dumbing Down," is featured on the compilation disc.

> Recently dubbed "a one man musical army," by Skratch magazine, Southerly is not what you would expect from your run-of-the-mill singer-songwriter. Beginning like most musical projects, in a basement/bedroom, Krist Kruger (a.k.a. Southerly) started as a solo project and has progressed to a full band. Taking cues from old-timers Woody Guthrie, Jimmy Rodgers, and Bill

Monroe, Southerly offers an anti-folk, rock and alternative country sound that is familiar yet fresh. Southerly is able to avoid being

lost in obscurity by bringing you in with his uniquely memorable style and sense of charm, ever-present on tracks such as Naomi Ruth (available on MySpace). Check out Southerly's newest album, Best Dressed and Expressionless at the bands MySpace page, www.myspace. com/southerly.

Singer-songwriter Thao Nguyen hails from the Virginia suburbs of Washington D.C. where she spent her time writing songs and creating music. Honing her skills at local Open Mic sessions, Nguyen sharpened her guitar and songwriting ability. Band members include Thao Nguyen on vocals and guitar, Willis Thompson on drums and percussion, Adam Thompson on bass, and Frank Stewart on lead guitar and percussion. The band offers an indie folk sound, which Thao describes as "tangles of guitar, and knots of singing create a rope fit to haul the heavy machinery of your day." After the band was asked to contribute their song "Feet Asleep," to the Kill Rock Stars' compilation disc, they also agreed to join the tour. The band is touring to support their debut album "Like the Linen," available online at insound. com for \$10.

Carolyn Berk, singer and lyricist for the Lovers, had known the owner of Kill Rock Stars for years and was asked to be a part of "The Sound the Hare Heard," contributing her song, "Honea," to the compilation. She will be traveling to Spokane solo, offering a sound influenced by her stay in Boston, Massachusetts and Athens, Georgia. She describes her sound as "somber and verbose" with "beautiful string arrangements, subtle vocal harmonies and layered soundscapes." Her voice resonates with a Bright Eye's like timbre, and her songs are filled with tales of love and loss. This triple crown of singer/songwriters is only \$7 at the door; all ages are welcome. Come and enjoy coffee and great music, in the garage turned coffee house/recording studio. With a seating capacity of 50people, The Shop can open its doors and accommodate 80 or more during the summer. Some by Sea

Some By Sea embark on western tour

It was by fortuitous chance that Some By Sea's quintet of musicians crossed paths. These five kids from neighboring suburbs in the shadow of Seattle, having just completed their sophomore album titled "On Fire! Igloo," are heading to Rock Coffee in downtown Spokane as part of the western tour for the new release. These five self-proclaimed music nerds will start the show at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 21st, accompanied by fellow Seattle indie-rockers Roy.

Perhaps it was never lead singer Chris Du Bray's intention to launch a full-blown project, but somehow the pieces fell together. Soon after tagging himself as Some By Sea in early 2003, Du Bray began playing solo acoustic shows within his Seattle locale. When a friend joined Du Bray, Some By Sea's evolution into a band quickly gained momentum, particularly with the addition Rachel Bowman on cello and piano.

Within a few months, and in trio formation, Some By Sea had already started recording what would become tracks for their debut, most notably with Bowman's classical influences adding an entirely new dimension to Du Bray's songwriting. After an encounter at one of the band's shows,

drummer Daniel Disparte and keyboardist/ lap steel/guitarist David Bilbrey joined the effort and completed the outfit.

February 21, 2006 saw the release of "On Fire! Igloo," the band's first proper release on SideCho Records. The new album is a sprawling, 70-minute opus that showcases the band's diversity and love of music.

Some By Sea's music is characterized by Du Bray's light, soothing voice, mixed with the classical interludes of Bowman's cello, backed by the steadfast rhythm of the band. Du Bray's voice backed by Bowman's angelic vocal and cello highlights catch your attention and leave you wanting more.

Joining Some By Sea is fellow Seattle band Roy. Roy is an ongoing experiment in music; an in-joke; an excuse to indulge in guilty pleasures. Headlining the show is The Noted from Spokane, who were added to the lineup after the completion of this article.

Cover for this all ages event is \$3. Beer and wine is available with ID. Be sure to get there early, as seating is limited. Rock Coffee is located at 920 W. First Avenue. For more information call 838-1864 or look online at SpokaneSiDEKiCK.com.

Kelly Hughes returns home to Stateline

Stateline's original honky-tonk hero, Kelly Hughes, is returning home with his band for two weekends of music and dancing at Big Al's Country Club in Stateline, Idaho. The Kelly Hughes Band will perform from 9:00 p.m. to close on Friday and Saturday, June 16th and 17th, with an encore performance the following weekend, Friday and Saturday, June 23rd and 24th.

Kelly Hughes became a local celebrity over the past 20 years as the former proprietor of the rocking and rowdy Kelly's Country Club, (now Big Al's) and as front man to the Kelly Hughes band. When he closed shop in June of 2004 to focus on his music, he left a hole in the local honkytonk scene that remained unfilled until Big Al's opened its doors in November 2004 at the former Kelly's Country Club. They have been going strong, attracting a standard group of diehards as well as a rotating array of college kids, bachelorette parties, and those just curious about the mechanical bull.

Hughes and his band return home this weekend for a concert that will get your butt off of Big Al's infamous picnic tables, and onto the dance floor. The band is Kelly Hughes leading the show on the microphone and rhythm guitar, Tania on lead guitar, Seth Humphries on bass, and Bob Levan on drums, playing a mix of country favorites and a handful of original tunes. Don't know how to dance? - grab a Kelly's Kicker (named after Kelly Hughes), a mystery blend of hard alcohol, etc. served in a pitcher. If a Kicker won't inspire you to dance, nothing will. Just beware the mechanical bull; a certain level of sobriety is recommended.

Cover for each night is \$4 and the fun is restricted to those 21 and over. Friday nights at Big Al's are ladies night, meaning ladies get in for free. Big Al's is located at 6152 W. Up and coming Hypnogaja performs with Stroke 9, Lucid

Stroke 9 comes to Fat Tuesday's on Friday, June 23rd with guests Hypnogaja and Lucid for an all ages show. Stroke 9 made headlines 6 years ago from their hit song "Little Black Backpack," which led their album "Nasty Little Thoughts" to the top of the charts in 2000. They are back with single "Kick Some Ass" from their fourth album "Rip It Off" which was also featured in the movie "Jay and Silent Bob Strike Back." Other movies and TV shows such as "Ed TV," "Scrubs," "Malcolm in the Middle," and "West Wing" have included some of the band's songs.

Recently, the band released a new album on February 9th entitled "Café Cuts," which, according to the band, showcases Stroke 9's "endearing blend of pop and indie rock stripped down to reveal the stories and feelings woven into each song." This album includes songs such as "Washin' and Wonderin'," "Vaccum Bag," and "Tear Me in Two." The album also features a new version of "Little Black Backpack," inspired by the hit single in 2000. Also on the schedule to rock is the California based band, Hypnogaja. Hypnogaja has toured the states playing with big names such as 311, Shinedown, cold and others. It's recent album, "Below Sunset," features their first hit single and music video, "They Don't Care," which can be viewed at www.hypnogaja.com. Their music has also been featured in television shows such as "Las Vegas" (NBC), "Tru Calling" (FOX), "Sex and the City" (HBO), "America's Next Top Model" (UPN) and the Mike Figgis-directed motion picture "Cold Creek Manor," starring Sharon Stone (Touchstone).

Hypnogaja has all the flair of a hard rock band, but all the musical prowess of

classically trained musicians. Their music lies somewhere in between, in a state of hypnogaja, the hazy dreamlike state between sleep and wakefulness. Through the deft weaving of Tim Groeschell and Jeeve's slashing guitar riffs, and the soaring keyboard melodies of Mark Nubar Donikian combined with the haunting yet beautiful voice of Jason "ShyBoy" Arnold, Hypnogaja's music will wake you from whatever sort of semiconscious state you're in. One minute this band can be rocking the doors off, and the next pulling you in with tender, painful ballads, highlighted by ShyBoy's hypnotic voice. This band may very well be the next big thing, be sure to see them perform live while you still have the chance. To hear acoustic samples from the band's newest releases, "Acoustic Sunset," go to www.MySpace.com/Hypnogaja. But remember, these boys like to rock and will do so at Fat Tuesdays.

Also sharing the stage with Stroke 9 is Spokane's own hard-rocking foursome, Lucid. Established almost six years ago, three of the band's songs have already reached number one on www.mp3.com. Lucid has also played with bands Papa Roach, Saliva, Trust Company and more, while rocking stages all over the Northwest in Washington, Idaho and Oregon. Their sound has been compared to Tool, Sevendust and Faith No More, and has undoubtedly made Lucid a Spokane favorite.

HOOPFEST

This year marks Hoopfest's 17th year - the world's largest 3-on-3 street basketball tournament is back, bigger and badder than ever. On Saturday and Sunday, June 24th and 25th, the streets of downtown Spokane will fill with over 145,000 people, including 24,000 players of all ages, for a weekend of basketball, music, food, entertainment, and more basketball. Festivities kick off at roughly 7:45 a.m. each day and continue into the evening.

Hoopfest began in 1990 with 2,009 players hooping it up on 30 street courts. Sixteen years later, Hoopfest spans 40 city blocks with over 400 courts. Players range in age from third graders to seventy-yearolds and the 121,000 spectators are even more diverse. When not competing for the coveted "winner's t-shirt," teams and spectators have access to a plethora of free distractions. Nike Center Court, located inside Riverfront Park, is the main stage to all basketball action. Watch former collegiate standouts and Hoop It Up World Champions compete to become Hoopfest champions, as well as a high-flying slam dunk competition on Saturday at 12:30 p.m. featuring a special slam dunk performance by Squatch, the Seattle Super Sonics' mascot.

While Hoopfest's adult athletes have been in the spotlight for years, this year's tournament offers young stars their own piece of the limelight at the Youth Center Court. Located along Spokane Falls Boulevard, the Dairy Farmers of Washington Youth Center Court is THE place to watch the region's hottest rising stars battle it out on the hot pavement. The Dairy Farmers of Washington will also be on hand with free samples and fun prizes. As an added bonus the Seattle SeaGals will perform on the court between games and will be available for autographs and pictures throughout the weekend.

For non-basketball fans, Hoopfest offers more alternatives than can be named. Riverfront Park features the Giant Screen IMAX Theatre, the 1909 Looff Carrousel, and a brand new Gondola Ride Over The Falls, as well as many other family attractions. For music fans, local bands will be performing throughout the day in the Clocktower Meadows. For more information, please see the sidebar. If the weather is really hot be sure to cool down at the new fountains, located next to the Carousel in Riverfront Park. In addition, all local restaurants, bars, and stores will be open, many providing Hoopfest specials.

Brand new for this year's Hoopfest is the Verizon Wireless Street Lounge - it is the hottest place to hang at Hoopfest. Located in Riverfront Park along Spokane Falls Boulevard, the lounge will be packed with games, interactive experiences, and the latest in mobile technology.

Due to massive I-90 construction

throughout downtown, travel may be a little bit more challenging. To solve this dilemma, Hoopfest and the Spokane Transit Authority (STA) have created a new system of parkand-ride lots with frequent transit service to and from downtown. STA is also bringing back the popular Hoopfest weekend pass that lets you ride any STA bus throughout the weekend for only \$2.00. Visit spokanehoopfest.net for more information or purchase your passes during Team Check-In.

Spokane Hoopfest Association is a Washington nonprofit corporation. Since inception, over \$835,000 has been donated to charities such as Special Olympics Washington and other local youth sports programs. Spokane Hoopfest Association has also built and renovated area basketball courts and, since 1994, 19 courts have been constructed or refurbished.

SR Records Battle of the Bands begins at the Blue Dolphin

SR Records and the Blue Dolphin kick off the 2006 SR Records Battle of the Bands Competition on Friday, June 23rd at the Blue Dolphin, located in Spokane Valley.

SR Records' main man Leo McLaughlin has been working hard to bring 12 outstanding local bands to the stage. With four rounds and a final fifth round, the competition will be spread out over a month, offering a new set of musicians each weekend.

At the first round on Friday, June 23rd, expect to see The Gutterballs from Spokane, Random Noise from Pullman, and Riled from Hayden. Each week there will also be a non-competing headliner. The first round will feature 3 Inch Max from Seattle.

The second round on Friday, June 30th, brings to the stage If You're Lucky, Peace Out, and The Price of Being, all

from Spokane, as well as headliner A Silenced Memory.

All of the bands competing were rounded-up by McLaughlin, owner of SR Records - as an incentive to compete, aside from rockin' the crowd, is a grand prize of up to 40 hours of studio time with SR Records. That's quite possibly enough time to cut a full-length album. SR Records will also throw in a CD release show, completely organized, scheduled and advertised upon request.

As for the runners up, preliminary round prizes include 5 hours studio time, enough to create a demo CD. In addition, 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners will win \$75, \$50 and \$25 respectively.

McLaughlin, who has been a musician for over 15 years, claims that while gigs are

often easier to find, studio time is another story. So, just recently, McLaughlin set up his own recording studio in the basement of his Spokane home, SR Records, in order to help bands like his own. With the BOB competition, he hopes to get talented bands on their way.

Judging the competition is a panel of judges including Terry "Big T" Swan who is also associated with the Blvd., John Mason of Fringe Records, and Janice Jarzebek of 2nd Nature Skate. Each person will be judging on overall sound marketability, stage performance and professional image. There will also be a popular vote from the crowd.

With the help of the judges, SR Records, Blue Dolphin and sponsors, The Spokane SiDEKiCK, Access Spokane, Spokane.net, Reflection Production,

Fringe Records and Pizza Rita, this competition will no doubt be rockin'. Be sure to head to the Blue Dolphin, Friday 23rd, for round one of the 2006 SR Records BOB Competition. The Blue Dolphin is located in the valley at 16 S. Robie Road. Tickets are \$5 per person or \$8 per couple. Riled is hard rock/ heavy metal that sounds unlike anything else out there. In the past a unsteady constantly changing lineup caused the band to hit many snags along the way, but with a now concrete lineup Riled is ready to unleash on the world. Armed with songs that have a original sound, and lyrics that actually have something to say, Riled is set to go in to the studio to record a new demo. With multiple battle of the bands this summer and other shows along the way, Riled is ready to start taking over the nw music scene.



3 Inch Max, Seattle (non-competing)

3 Inch Max is a collective of four revolutionists brought together in a rush of punk intensity and melody. Youth Bands vie for Recording Package

Get ready to rock. BOBfest is back and 12 of the areas most talented bands will be taking the stage to compete for their shot at a recording package. On June 17th, starting at 1:00 p.m., the Clocktower Meadow in Riverfront Park will be jammin' with tunes from Story Untold, Poison Most Foul, All in Favor, Small Town Nation, Sunset High, Edward Bugg, For Years Blue, Cyrus Fell Down, Electrostatics, Vax Lavaia, and Logan Heftel and Band.

In the past and the present, teen musicians have been, and are still, too often shed in a negative light as detractors from society rather than productive contributing members who have the talent to entertain, inspire, and inform. BOBfest offers the opportunity for young musicians in the Spokane area to showcase their talent, share their ideas, thoughts, and feelings, and entertain their community.

Admission is free for all who wish to attend. The 14 year-old event is produced by the Chase Youth Commission's Teen Advisory Council (TAC) in conjunction with Hoffman's Music. Co-sponsors of the event are College Road Recording, Zumies, Cuda Sportswear, KXLY, and the Spokesman-Review.

The 12 bands set to perform were selected from demos submitted in January. Selection for participation in the event includes the opportunity to experience the realm of the professional music industry. In addition to performing on June 17th, the bands have had the opportunity to participate in a Musician's Clinic, benefit from mentorship from professional musicians, and meet their Hoffman's "Road Crew".

Hoffman's music roles out the red carpet treatment for these young musicians. They provide a fully experienced technical crew and professional equipment for each of the bands to use. Each of 12 bands are also rewarded the opportunity of spending time in a recording studio to record an original track. These tracks are compiled into the BOBfest 2006 CD to

memorialize the event.

The June 17th concert will run from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., with each band playing a set of three songs. A panel of judges has been assembled to judge each band's performance and select a winner. This year's panel of judges includes Isamu Jordan from the Spokesman-Review, Ashley Graham a music editor for Out There Monthly, and Luck Baumgartner from The Inlander. Profiles and music from each of the bands are posted on the Spokesman-Review's website prior to the concert.

BOBfest was established 14 years ago with the intent of highlighting teen musicians in a positive light. The Chase Youth Commission's Teen Advisory Council (TAC) is an organization that works to identify the needs and issues facing young people in the Spokane community. The TAC is made up of an eclectic group of teens throughout the County. Members include ASB Presidents, skateboarders, members of the GLBTQ, as well as other teens with diverse interests and backgrounds. This organization also addresses issues ranging from teen pregnancy and self-esteem to the stereotypes faced by the skateboarding community.

In the days leading up to BOBfest, KXLY will host the competing bands in the morning to perform live on the morning news. KXLY will also be airing other promos during the evening news. Whispers among the media entertainment community suggest that Tripp Rogers and 94.5 FM may broadcast the event live from Riverfront Park on June 17th.

Future aspirations for the event include the purchase of a new 20'x24' stage that would enable the event to be moved to a prime location near the Runner's Statue along the main road and adjacent to the downtown business area. At this time, the cost of the stage is beyond the means of the event organizers but they are hopeful that the 30-year old portable stage (that has been in use since 1974) will be replaced in the near future.

LOCAL ARTIST SPOTLIGHT Kristen Marlo

Over a year of open mic nights, 20-year-old singer and songwriter Kristen Marlo has built a fan base so loyal she occasionally gets marriage proposals from those in its ranks, male and female alike. The popularity of her 20-minute, Tuesdaynight sets also earned her a spot in Rock Coffee's Best of Open Mic Night, and she quickly parlayed that success into a host of other regular gigs, including frequent appearances at Sonic Burrito and Caterina Winery. Ambitious to undertake a Northwest tour next summer, the only thing standing in her way is her commitment to the Air Force.

For more than just the time it detracts from her music, however, she has trouble reconciling her personal and work lives. Considering that she once ditched 28 consecutive days of school out of resentment for having to be there, it is not surprising that she rails against the discipline and uniformity of military life. The decision to enlist, she says, was made after one unhappy semester of junior college, and in the footsteps of her older brother Nick, who also strongly influenced her music.

But like a cherry bomb in a trash can, the constraints of military life provide the emotional heat that sparks her creativity. With few other diversions, lengthy deployments to the Middle East in support of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan allowed ample time for the creative process. Ignite all that free time with the failure of her first love affair, brought about by the stress of long distances for a long time, and you could practically sit back and watch her songs drag themselves from the shrapnel.

Thematically, Marlo compares the issues her music addresses to those of female artists such as Vanessa Carlton, Norah Jones, Michelle Branch and Sarah McLachlan. She would also aspire to model her career,

should the time come, after theirs.

"I like that they are never in the tabloids. They are real musicians, actual singer/songwriters, rather than just entertainers," she says.

Despite her affinity for these women, Marlo credits mostly male artists for providing stylistic impetus. Jason Mraz, Howie Day, Tyler Hilton and Gavin De-Graw take turns in her car, and she counts most of them amongst her MySpace friends. She also has a wall in her house, albeit not in her bedroom, devoted to autographs and pictures of her with the aforementioned. Hilton also has the distinction of being the only artist whose work she covers regularly, preferring to play her own music almost exclusively.

With the notable exception of the aptly titled "Nonsense Song," most of Marlo's originals are love songs. Her voice has an ethereal equality that makes it the perfect vehicle for their delivery. This combination allows her audience to share her longing so completely that hers is sometimes described as a siren's voice, as if she were luring listeners to their demise. She has also, she says, been described as a castle with a moat to protect her and a drawbridge she rarely lowers. Yes, she is a little guarded she admits, but if you really want to know her, you only have to listen when she sings.





- "Spokane Food not Bombs" a docu-


mentary by Erik Peterson






Slayer makes Unholy Alliance Tour stop at the Spokane Arena


